

International and local peer to peer programs

Approach of on the job coaching implemented in many countries internationally including UK and EU, US, Kyrgyzstan and Bangladesh.


In Lebanon many workshops have been hosted with heads of municipalities, and next stage is to provide on the job coaching on the ground.

Web based learning and exchange


- ACTED have recently launched a website calling on local authorities/communities to promote the good work they are doing

- Host Municipality Network another platform for exchange in Lebanon









Environmental degradation

- Lebanese authorities are finding themselves further and further strained by SWM in Lebanon
- Need improved community solid waste management to reduce the impact of the garbage crisis in densely populated urban areas – starting with Beirut
- Perceived willingness for communities to be engaged in the restoration of the environment

Decreased household level cash assistance

- Need for improved access and/or the provision of income-generating opportunities for vulnerable populations
- 416 bike riders hired for part time employment collecting waste from households
- 20 women hired to cater for the workers
