Webinar (WEB-2) on marine litter monitoring for the Peers of P2P-3

27 March 2018, 14.00-16.00 (Athens time)

Within the framework of the P2P-3, a **two-hour webinar** on Marine Litter Monitoring (WEB-2) was carried out on the 27th of March 2018. The webinar was attended by the group of Peers from the beneficiary countries (Algeria, Egypt, Morocco) as shown in Table1 (9 participants in total). During the webinar the participants provided a quick overview of the progress of each country with regards to the implementation of the related expert facility activities and the peer-to-peer exchange on marine litter monitoring.

The Algerian peers reported that the surveyors team has been setup in the 14 wilayas and that two beaches per wilayas will be surveyed, resulting in 28 survey sites. Furthermore, they informed the peers that the first set of surveys has been scheduled for April 2018.

The Egyptian peers reported that the have setup up their surveyors team as well and that they have identified the sites to be monitored. However, they might survey two more sites. They also have scheduled their first surveys in April 2018.

The Moroccan peers informed the group that they have not yet started with the monitoring and informed that they will be formally requesting to strengthen this activity by cancelling another SWIM-H2020 SM Expert Facility activity and transferring the resources.
