Preliminary Conditions

Strong institutional framework

Sound resource planification and administration


Clear watershed and sub-basin identification (Quantitative and qualitative)



Interministerial Water Commission (France)

Composition

Representatives of the Ministries involved in water

- Chairman: Water Director (or representative)
- Members: Environment, Agriculture, Industry, Public Health, Interior...


Attributions

Advises the Minister in charge of water about every draft law, decree, order being prepared upon water issues

- Consultation is compulsory
- Procedure can be cancelled if this step is skipped

Accepted General Legal Principles

- 1. Water is a single unitary resource
- 2. Water is a common good of the Nation
- 3. Water preservation is of general interest
- 4. Priority is given to drinking resource
- 5. Water resource management must be integrated and sustainable
- 6. Climate change shall be included in policies
- The use of water resources must be planned
- 8. State controls the uses
- 9. The basin level is the most appropriate geographical unit
- 10. The local authorities must be taken into account














In France, Basin Committees are like Water

What are Basin Agencies?

Principle

- Geographic, hydrographic unity (= Basin District)
- Financial solidarity

Nature

- Public administrative authority decentralised at basin level
- Under supervision of Ministry of Environment

Actions

- Taxes collection & subsidies distribution
- Research studies and data collection
- No works, building nor permit issuance





Sub-Basin mapping (since 1992)


175 sub-basins with:




European Directive WFD 2000/60





Declaration

The Consequences of Two Different Procedures

Declaration = non opposition principle

- Incl. Hydrological Impact Document (HID)
- Delivered by Prefect services (3 month)



— > Declaration receipt

Based on national technical prescriptions (orders)

Authorization = deeper investigation (impact...)

- Incl. HID + EIA + public participation...
- Delivered by Prefect services (9 month)



— > Authorization Order

Based on national technical prescriptions (orders) tailored with complementary case-by-case prescriptions



Focus on: Hydrological Impact Document

Content

- Origin of the chronic, occasional or accidental impacts
- Impact on water and on human activities
- Influence of seasonal variations
- Measures for reducing the impacts
- Compatibility with RBMP and Sub-RBMP
- Impact on Natura 2000 sites





Focus on: Hydrological Impact Document

Administration control

- Absent = illegal procedure
- Incomplete or insufficient = slow down procedure

Court control

- Environmental Impact Assessment + Hydrological Impact Document are in the heart of the Judge's control
- Authorisation cancelled for absence or insufficient of report on compatibility with RBMP and Sub-RBMP or endangered species not taken in account

Water Police Inspection Corps

Responsibilty: Ministry en Environment (via Prefects):

- Coordinated by special service (departement / Prefect level)
- Uniforms and weapons
- 1000 agents
- 30 000 controls / year
- 3500 legal reports







Water Police Duties

Both administrative and judiciary roles:

- Administative controls :
 - Based on declaration receipt or authorization order
 - On paper & on site controls
 - Regular or without notice
- Criminal investigations and reports :
 - Research based on public complaints, judge's request...
 - Ascertainment based on any existing criminal legal definition









Administrative and Penal Sanctions



Administrative Sanctions

Special inspection agents from central and local administrations



- Finding of the irregular situation
- Formal mandatory notice
- Technical prescriptions
- Budget retention
- Works execution (substitution)
- Suspension of activity
- Closing down

Urgent situations
No direct victims
Simple procedure

Categories of Penal Sanctions

Crimes: environmental terrorism

 Offenses: operation without authorization permit, failure to comply with a formal notice, barrier to inspection. Up to € 75,000 € 150,000 penalty. From 1 up to 2 years imprisonment.



Violations: operation without declaration permit.... Penalties up to € 1500 for a natural person and € 7500 for a legal entity.

Examples of Penal Sanctions

Water pollution

⇒ up to € 75,000 / 2 years in prison

Destruction of fish

⇒ up to € 18,000 / 2 years in prison



- + Complementary penalties: display by press, confiscation of property (vehicle, boat, plane), prohibition to exercise up to 5 years, site restoration...
- + After justice procedure initiated by General prosecutor or victim (several years, with appeal...) or both.



Deterrent / preventive effect Possible victims civil compensation

Penal Transaction Mechanism

General prosecutor can initiate a penal transaction before the criminal action is opened. Must be accepted by the polluter. The transaction is approved by the prosecutor after negotiation on conditions / context: depending on the circumstances and gravity of the offense, the personality of the perpetrator and its resources and charges

Capped: 1/3 of the fine due

The transaction extinguishes the penal action to the payment of the fine (not the civil action)
